MILESTONES:

- 1 **March 1781** – Articles of Confederation go into effect.
- 2 **March 1949** – The Lucky Lady II, a B-52 Superfortress Bomber, becomes the first plane to fly nonstop around the world, refueling 4 times in the air along the way.
- 8 **March 1965** – The first US combat troops arrive in South Vietnam when Marines land near Da Nang to secure an air base.
- 15 **March 1919** – American Legion 90th Birthday
- 17 **March** – St. Patrick's Day
- 20 **March 1922** – The USS Langley, converted from collier USS Jupiter, is commissioned as the first US Navy aircraft carrier.

Shortly after World War I ended, twenty officers of the American Expeditionary Forces met in Paris with orders to confer on how the Army could improve troop morale. One of the officers, LTC Theodore Roosevelt Jr., son of President Theodore Roosevelt, suggested an idea that had already crossed many of the men's minds: an organization in which veterans could stay in touch, help each other, and work together after the fighting was over.

The officers wasted no time putting the idea into action. On March 15, 1919, about one thousand US soldiers gathered in Paris for the very first meeting of the American Legion.

Today the Legion is the nation's largest veteran's organization, with nearly 3 million members. Men and Women may join if they have served honorably in the US armed Forces during times of hostilities, such as World War II, the Korean War, Vietnam War, Persian Gulf War and Iraq War..

The Legion's purpose is partly to help veterans continue friendships made during military service. It also gives members a way to keep serving their country. The American Legion has built parks and playgrounds, donated equipment to hospitals and fire halls, sponsored Boy Scout Troops and youth baseball leagues, promoted the study of the Constitution in schools and much more.

For God and Country is the American Legion motto. The organization has nearly 15,000 posts worldwide. There is probably one near you, and your community is most certainly a better place for it.

NY State Veterans Benefit - Blind Annuity

The Blind Annuity Program benefit is for legally blind NYS wartime veterans or the surviving un-remarried spouse of the blind veteran. The program authorizes an annuity payment of up to \$1,128.72 per veteran.

Who is eligible for the Blind Annuity?

To be eligible, an applicant must meet the following requirements:

- Resident of New York State
- Veteran has been determined legally blind*
(20/200 vision in the better eye with best correction)

Or



- 20 Degree limitation of field of vision AND
- Served on active duty (other than for training) for 90 days or more during any of the following:
 - April 11, 1899 – July 4, 1902
 - May 9, 1916 – April 4, 1917
 - April 6, 1917 – Nov 11, 1918
 - Dec 7, 1941 – Dec 31, 1946
 - June 27, 1950 – Jan 31, 1955
 - Feb 28, 1961 – May 7, 1975
 - Aug 2, 1990 – End of conflict

Or


- Received the Armed Forces, Navy, or Marine Corps Expeditionary Medal, for participation in:
 - Lebanon – June 1, 1983 – Dec 1, 1987
 - Grenada – Oct 23, 1983 – Nov 21, 1983
 - Panama – Dec 20, 1989 – Jan 31, 1990

Complete and submit the following forms to the NYS Division of Veterans' Affairs:

- [Report of Legal Blindness \(Form OCFS-4599\)](#) 
- Evidence of Military Service
- Marriage and Death Certificate (for un-remarried surviving spouse)

What documentation is required to prove eligibility?

- Evidence of Military Service (DD 214/copy of a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty)
- Completed [Report of Legal Blindness](#)  (from eye doctor)
- Marriage or death certificate if applicable
